# Activity report: Participation in the NERIS workshop 2026

I would like to express my sincere gratitude to PIANOFORTE for the travel support that enabled me to attend the NERIS Workshop in Paris. The support made it possible for me to participate in this important scientific meeting and present my ongoing research as a poster presentation.

The NERIS Workshop focuses on nuclear and radiological emergency response, a research area that aligns closely with my current work and long-term professional interests. NERIS is usually held as a one-day satellite meeting during the European Radiation Protection Week (ERPW), and it has been the main reasons for my participation in the ERPW for several years. This year, however, the workshop was organized as a stand-alone meeting over two and a half days, which provided an especially valuable opportunity for me, as it enabled more scientific exchange, networking, and in-depth discussions within the field.

During the workshop, I presented a poster on an ongoing project that I am leading, focusing on radioactive iodine triage following nuclear and radiological events. The NERIS Workshop was a highly suitable forum for presenting this study, as it brought together experts and stakeholders working specifically with emergency preparedness, response, and radiological protection. Presenting the poster allowed me to share preliminary findings, receive feedback from specialists in the field, and discuss the relevance and potential applications of the project in emergency preparedness contexts.

The meeting was also important for strengthening professional relationships and establishing new contacts that may lead to future collaborations. As I am currently a postdoctoral researcher in emergency preparedness response and radiological protection at the University of Gothenburg and involved in the national emergency preparedness in Sweden, participation in the NERIS Workshop was highly relevant for my continued development within the field.
